The in-depth training which follows particular equipment is required as much of the work happens in dangerous scenarios and hazardous scenes so the operator must be able to ensure a safe working surroundings at all times. The safety training is essential as well as the communications training which helps the crew on the ground be able to always communicate with the operator.

Heavy equipment machinery usually work in extreme surroundings and are put under great strain regularly. Therefore, there are many heavy machine jobs available in maintenance and repair. Operators of heavy machinery are very trained workers who can diagnose, troubleshoot and repair heavy equipment on site or in a workshop. Mechanics must be available to transport their tools to a job site and perform maintenance and repair in different settings.

On occasion it may be possible for delivery drivers to operate machinery with just a simple CDL. Nonetheless, several jobs would need more particular training. Drivers who have to handle large machinery or components for building projects would need the heavy machinery operator to complete further training. Normally, the drivers operate with chaperone vehicles that are driven by trained drivers. These chaperone vehicles typically escort the delivery truck to its destination.
